BEBASHI DIRECTS ONE OF THE LARGEST INDEPENDENT, COMMUNITY-BASED EDUCATION PROGRAMS IN THE COUNTRY.

Since 1985, BEBASHI has provided information and education about sexual health issues, particularly HIV INFECTION and AIDS (Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome), to the African-American and Hispanic communities in the Philadelphia area.

African-American and Hispanic communities are at higher risk for AIDS because of the lack of information targeted to them.

FREEDOM THEATRE has trained over 7,500 students in the theatre arts, providing them with a unique opportunity to experience personal growth through participation in the living arts. Located at 1346 N. Broad Street, FREEDOM THEATRE produces a full season of plays and teaches acting, creative dramatics, dance, and singing to children and adults ages 3 through infinity.
