
Dear Mr. Wallington:

As part of its bi-annual in-service teacher training program, the predominately white District will hold a Sensitivity Day to sensitize teachers to ethnic and cultural diversity within the District. Because she was impressed with your comments, my mother would like to submit your name and credentials as a potential speaker. We need strong, non-compromising African Americans to influence the hiring policies of the District. Currently, there is one African American person at my former high school, and no other African American personnel, besides the two janitors, who are brothers.

So as you can see, African American people within the District need counsel, aid, and advocacy desperately. I trust that you will not disappoint us.
