


Thursday September 25, 1986 Philadelphia, Pennsylvania

We are gathered in sadness and in rage, with a clear moral and political agenda. While the city of Philadelphia has spent some Federal money on AIDS surveillance, its support for efforts to help victims of AIDS and to educate the community clearly falls short of the tremendous need. The graphs below demonstrate that although the number of people with AIDS in Philadelphia is similar to other East Coast cities, the level of funding here is substantially lower. The State of Pennsylvania's contribution has been even less.

We lift our voices to proclaim that AIDS is a disease that effects everyone. Agencies responsible for the public welfare must respond with much greater vigor. Contact your elected representatives this fall as budgets are being prepared. Let them know what their priority should be. Lives depend on it.
