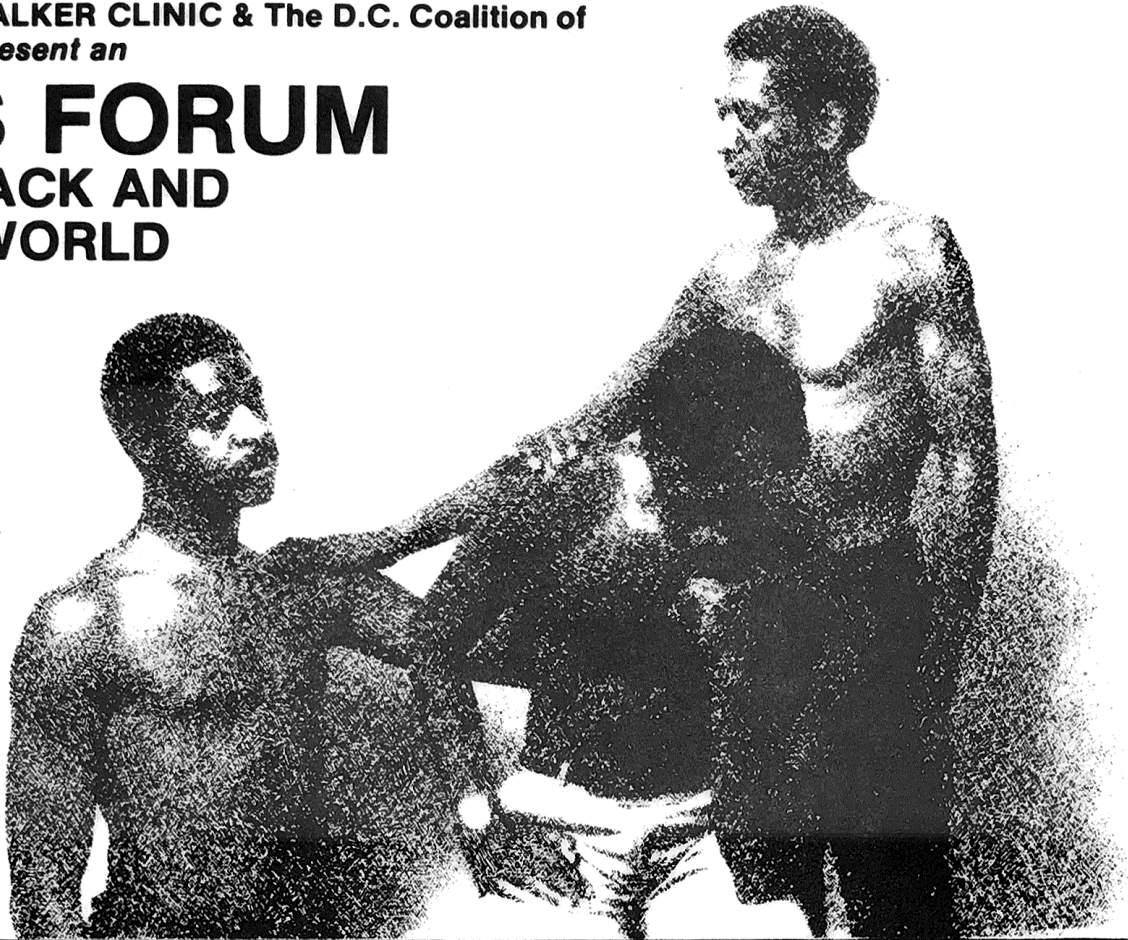

Blacks and other third-world gays are highly susceptible to AIDS, also.

The U.S. Public Health Service reports that as of September 1st there are 2,157 reported cases of Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome (AIDS). Of the cases reported in the U.S., 57% of the victims are white, 27% are Black, 14% are Hispanic, the remaining 1.5% are of unknown racial identity. To date 852 cases have resulted in fatality. Figures indicate that at least

41.5% of those who have contracted the disease are minorities.

There has to be a solution. We must educate ourselves about the facts and attempt to prevent the spreading of this disease until it is curable.

Encourage your friends to attend this special seminar for Blacks and Third-World gays. We owe it to ourselves. This forum will present speakers who openly and frankly discuss known information on

preventive measures, symptoms, AIDS hotlines and community support services, . . . and much more. Be There.
